Andrew Cayley KC commenced his role as Principal Trial Lawyer at the ICC at the start of March 2024.

On 1 April 2021, Andrew Cayley KC was appointed by the Attorney General to be the Chief Inspector of Her Majesty's Crown Prosecution Service Inspectorate (HMCPSI), this role came to an end in February 2024

From 2013 to 2020, Andrew was the Director of Service Prosecutions, the United Kingdom's most senior military prosecutor.

In 2009, he was appointed the Chief International Co-Prosecutor of the Extraordinary Chambers in the Courts of Cambodia, the Khmer Rouge Tribunal, by the Secretary General of the United Nations.

From 2007 to 2009, he defended Charles Taylor, the former President of Liberia, before the Special Court for Sierra Leone and Ivan Cermak before the International Criminal Tribunal for the former Yugoslavia (ICTY).
